## Dr Henry Christopher Darby: Died 22<sup>nd</sup> January 1937 aged 68

Henry Darby was a doctor in Lye for 45 years. For many years he was connected with the Congregational Church and would hold Magic Lantern picture shows for local children. He also organised the group to become the **Golden Opportunity** messengers – a group of young people who undertook "good deeds" around the area.

Dr Darby was also invovled in the Lye Branch of the **St John's Ambulance Brigade.** 

He is reputed to be amongst the first people in Lye to own a **motor car**.

- 2. Can you find this address on a current map? Can you find the address on an historic map dating from around that year?
- 3. What is the St John's Ambulance Brigade? What did they do and do they still exist today?
