Pioneer William Henry Trevis WE/205147 Royal Engineers Died 6th December 1918 aged 26

Extract taken from a newspaper of the time:

"Sapper William Henry Trevis, an officer's servant in the R.E. Eldest son of Mr and Mrs F Trevis 125 Birminhgam Street, Stourbridge, died in Wordsley Military Hosptial yesterday week from influenza and pneumonia. He came home on leave three weeks earlier and was taken ill while at home. He was within a few weeks of his 26th birthday. Sapper Trevis joined the army early in 1915 and had been in France for about two years. He was formlerly employed by Messrs B Perkins and Son of Amblecote".
