







Science: KS2 Seed Dispersal



Seeds need to be scattered (dispersed) to ensure the plants or trees have a good chance of finding the correct conditions to grow.

As you walk around the cemetery, can you find any evidence for seed dispersal? Seeds can be dispersed by the wind, by being eaten by animals and then coming out in their poo or by sticking to an animals fur, or insects wing and being carried around.
